1. **Align/develop “Best Practice” strategies** from the policy review process in reference to the Revised: WA State CAT Policy Goals
2. **Align/develop One (1) “Illustrative Action”** for each strategy
3. **Mark up the Draft WSDOT CAT Policy Framework** to incorporate the Revised Goal statements and the strategies and illustrative actions from Steps 1 and 2 to produce a Draft WA State CAT Policy Framework
4. Present the Draft WA State CAT Policy Framework to the Infrastructure & Systems Subcommittee on **Sept. 9th** for discussion / vote on revisions.
5. Package the “results of the Sept. 9th discussion/vote”, including a minority report, for presentation at the **Sept. 26th** AV Work Group Executive Committee
6. Receive and incorporate input from the AV Work Group Executive Committee
7. **Continue revising / adding strategies & illustrative actions as needed through 2019 & 2020**
8. Continue working towards a final Proposed WA State CAT Policy Framework
