

- 3. Mark up the Draft WSDOT CAT Policy Framework to incorporate the Revised Goal statements and the strategies and illustrative actions from Steps 1 and 2 to produce a Draft WA State CAT Policy Framework
- 4. Present the Draft <u>WA State CAT Policy Framework to the Infrastructure & Systems Subcommittee on Sept. 9th for discussion / vote on revisions.</u>
- Package the "results of the Sept. 9th discussion/vote", including a minority report, for presentation at the Sept. 26th AV Work Group Executive Committee
- 6. Receive and incorporate input from the AV Work Group Executive Committee
- Continue revising / adding strategies & illustrative actions as needed through 2019 & 2020
- 8. Continue working towards a final Proposed WA State CAT Policy Framework
