Proposed CAT Policy Goals

- 1. Proposed-Organize for Innovation: Enable organizational change that empowers officials to be flexible, accelerate decision-making, and adapt to changing technology.**
Original WSDOT: Organize for Innovation: Flexibly and quickly adapt to changes in technology and transportation advancements.
- 2. Proposed-Shared Mobility: Incentivize high occupancy and shared modes for moving people and goods.**
Original WSDOT: Shared Mobility: Encourage and incentivize shared mobility, including an emphasis on high capacity transit and Mobility as a Service.
- 3. Proposed-Economic Vitality and Livability: Create resilient and efficient regional networks and empower local agencies to create resilient, multimodal local networks.**
Original WSDOT: Economic Vitality and Livability: Empower local partners to achieve their economic vitality and livability goals
- 4. Proposed-Infrastructure and Context Sensitive Street Design: Promote durable physical and digital networks that enhance adjacent spaces.**
Original WSDOT: Infrastructure and Context Sensitive Street Design: Safely and efficiently, accommodate people with special transportation needs, pedestrians, bicyclists, public transportation, freight, and automated vehicles.
- 5. Proposed-Land Use: Encourage land use development patterns that support multimodal connectivity to efficient local and regional networks.**
Original WSDOT: Land Use: Encourage development of dense, vibrant, and transit-oriented communities in urban areas while preserving and enhancing rural and resource lands.
- 6. Proposed-Equity: Work with marginalized communities to increase access to desirable mobility options.**
Original WSDOT: Equity: Use CAT to meet the needs of traditionally marginalized communities.
- 7. Proposed-Safety- Promote mobility options that reduce the rate of death and injury for individuals.**
Original WSDOT: Safety: Increase the safety and security of people and communities.
- 8. Proposed-Environment: Reduce the local and cumulative environmental impacts of mobility to improve air quality and mitigate climate change.**
Original WSDOT: Environment: Enhance the environment with a focus on air quality.
